President, Wilton Guillory showed the group the Gulf Coast Orchid Society newsletter. GCOS has a show in February 2023 in Gautier, MS at the Gauthier Convention Center.

The Cypridpedium project was discussed again this month. Dr. Jim Barnett got in touch with Kevin Allen who is now working at Longwood Gardens in PA. He now has the resources and tissue lab to propagate *Cypripedium kentuckiense* for us. However, we would need a viable seedpod from Kisatchie to accomplish this repopulating Kisatchie project. Kevin Allen has four mature plants in Haynesville, LA. Dr. Jim Barnett will discuss this collection of seedpods with Dave Moore with Kisatchie NF. Wilton Guillory will get in touch with Dr. Charles Allen to get his input on the project and to see if it would be possible to collect seedpods from the Fort Polk, LA population of *Cyp. kentuckiense*.

Russel Derouche, Jr. brought extra plants of his *Habenaria repens* commonly called Water Spider Orchid to be raffled at the meeting. He explained that he was collecting water hyacinths from Blind River near Grammercy when he unintentionally also collected the *Habenaria repens*. He explained that he grows it in water feature and it makes seeds as well.

Nine members attended this month.

## **Tip of the Month**

We usually receive our first cold fronts this month, so if you are growing outdoors, this is the time for you to make your winter preparations. Check your winter structure, test fire your heaters and start cleaning your plants. The shortening day length and cooler nights initiate all sorts of changes in your orchids. Your plants require less water and fertilizer now. Observe the rate at which your plants dry out after watering and make adjustments, gradually adding days in between your normally watering cycle. Consider removing shading from the greenhouse to allow more light during the winter months.

The Central Louisiana Orchid Society is the sponsor of the Louisiana AOS Judging Center in Alexandria. Anyone interested in getting an orchid judged to be considered for an AOS award can bring a plant in.

Part of our society's responsibility is providing a clerk to assist with judging. Our Judging Center is in need of two more clerks to share the duties with Connie. With three members splitting the clerking duties, each person would only have to clerk four times a year! Judging takes place on the fourth Saturday of the month.

Please talk to Connie and Wilton if you can step up to help.






